- (2) Installation of flooring in interior room approximately 14' x 16' at the site. Work includes removal of baseboards; removal of hardwood and plywood flooring, installation of flooring as specified above, replacement of baseboard with any wood damaged in removal replaced to match the remainder.
 - a. Perform daily clean-up of work area. All debris must be disposed of in a legally acceptable manner.
 - b. Contractor shall have a valid current State of Pennsylvania Contractor License
